Urgency

- We still have time to save the natural assets.
- If we let urbanization strip away our natural assets, they will be gone forever.

• <u>High Priority</u>: Need to limit encroachment on flood plain.





Municipal Storm Water Controls

Local ordinances limiting encroachment in floodplain

MS4 Permitting includes activities such as:

- Public Education and Outreach
- Construction Site Runoff Control
- Illicit Discharge Elimination
- Pollution Prevention & Good Housekeeping
- Industrial Stormwater

Water Conservation Demonstration Garden

 Features native and adapted plants.

Requires less water.

Needs less maintenance.

 Proper disposal of solvents, cleaners, batteries, paint, pesticides and weed killers.

Established in 2010

- 501 (C)(3) Non-Profit Land Trust
- Preserve Riparian Areas and other Key Watershed Features
- Accept Conservation Easements
- Landowner Outreach and Education





Conservation Easements



- Landowners, cities, developers
- Benefits to landowners and the public
- Protects natural, riparian areas on the land
- Allows a property owner to continue to own & use the land
- Limits development rights to extent specified
- Runs with the land in perpetuity



Greenbelts . . .

- Protect water quality
- Lessen flooding impacts
- Enhance the quality of life
- Provide nature-based educational opportunities and experiences
- Preserve wildlife and aquatic habitat















Greenbelt Plan:

- ✓ Guide preservation of greenbelts and related natural areas
- ✓ Identify strategic areas for establishing greenbelt corridors
- ✓ Advocate a common vision for multi-use greenbelts
- ✓ Provide a toolbox of implementation strategies






