


Fort Worth District



Fort Worth District

- Plans, designs, builds, operates and maintains the state transportation system in nine counties: Erath, Hood, Jack, Johnson, Palo Pinto, Parker, Somervell, Tarrant and Wise
- Encompasses 6,949 square miles
- Lane miles of state system roadways: 8,959
- Serves approximately 2.3 million people
- Approximately 2.3 million registered vehicles
- Six area offices and
 10 maintenance offices

Fort Worth District Projects Update

- \$2 billion in construction on select regional projects
- \$1.7 billion in current FTW traditional projects construction
 - I-30/SH 360 Interchange
 - SH 199 between Azle & Fort Worth
 - US 67 in Cleburne
- Key projects to be completed this year:
 - Interstate 35W
 - SH 121/360 Interchange
 - SH 360 South



I-820 East Loop (Texas Clear Lanes)

I-820 East Loop

SH 121/183 to Randol Mill Rd

- Est. total cost: \$174M(congestion relief funding)
- -3.7 miles
- Add one mainlane each direction
- Replace bridges for SH 10 and Trinity River
- Re-beam SB I-820
 bridges over SH 121
 and TRE Railroad
- I-820 direct connections to SH 121
- Construction begins: Summer 2018



SH 121 North (Texas Clear Lanes)

- Interchanges at I-635 and FM 2499
 - Including reconstruction of the Bass Pro Drive bridge and frontage road reconstruction
- Builds on existing efforts and ultimately addresses gridlock
- Total cost: \$370M(congestion relief funding)
- Est. construction: Late Summer 2018
- Est. completion: 2022






SH 360 from ½ mile north of Randol Mill Rd to I-20

- Add one mainlane each direction with ramp improvements
- Est. construction cost: \$60M
- Est. award: February 2018
- Est. completion: 2021



McLeroy Blvd to US 287


- 4 miles
- Proposed 4-lane divided roadway
- Est. construction cost:\$55M
- Est. public hearing:Spring 2018
- Est. award: **2018***
- *dependent on ROW and utilities



US 377 Cresson Relief Route

US 377 at SH 171

- Proposed 4-lane divided roadway
- Est. construction cost: \$70M
- Est. award: August 2018
- Est. completion: 2022



Fort Worth District Planning Efforts

- \$7 billion in planning projects in Fort Worth District
- Projects in development:
 - Southeast Connector
 - I-20/30 in Parker & Tarrant County
 - I-20 in Arlington
