





Fort Worth District Boundaries



Set-Asides & "The Rule of Two"

Set-Asides & "The Rule of Two"

 \$3,500-\$150,000: "Automatically reserved exclusively for small business..."

FAR 19.502-2(a)

 Over \$150,000: Shall be set aside for small business when there is a reasonable expectation that:

Rule of Two "(1) offers will be obtained from at least two responsible small business concerns..."

"(2) award will be made at fair market prices..."



 FAR 19.203(a)
- Discretion of the Contracting Officer
 - Previous procurement history
 - Results of market research
 - How agency is doing in meeting its SB goals
 - Input from Agency SB specialist
 FAR 19.203(d)
- However SB set-asides have priority over acquisitions using full & open competition.

8(a) Business Development Program

- 8(a) Business Development Program FAR Subpart 19.8, 13 CFR Part 124
 - Socially and Economically disadvantaged small businesses
 - 51% owned/controlled by qualified individuals
 - SBA Certification required. Annual reviews.
 - Business Development and contract assistance
 - All 8(a) firms are SDBs but not all SDBs are 8(a)
 - Sole Source, Competitive Set-Asides, Joint Ventures, Mentor-Protégé arrangement available
 - "Once 8(a), always 8(a)" rule If a requirement has been accepted by SBA under the 8(a) Program, it must remain in the 8(a) Program unless SBA agrees to its release.

HUBZone Program – Background

- Historically Underutilized Business Zone (HUBZone) Program FAR Subpart 19.13 & 13 CFR Part 126
 - Enacted into law under Small Business Reauthorization Act of 1997
 - Encourages economic development in historically underutilized business zones - "HUBZones" - through the establishment of preferences
 - Helps small businesses in urban and rural communities gain preferential access to Federal procurement opportunities



HUBZone Program - Overview

■ HUBZone Program – Overview of other things to know....

- 51% owned/controlled by US Citizen, Community Development Corp, Agricultural Cooperative or an Indian Tribe
- Principal office must be in a designated HUBZone (see HUBZone maps)
- At least 35% of employees must live in a HUBZone (see HUBZone maps)
- SBA Certification required. Periodic reviews
- 3% government wide goal for HUBZone awards
- Set-Asides restricted to certified HUBZones available
- 10% Price Evaluation Preference (PEP) available



HUBZone Program – Certification

SBA administers the HUBZone Program

- Status as a HUBZone small business concern (SBC) is determined by SBA, pursuant to 13 CFR part 126
- A firm must apply to SBA for HUBZone certification (13 CFR 126.300 to 126.309)
- If SBA determines that a concern is a HUBZone SBC, SBA will issue a certification to that effect and will add the concern to the List of Qualified HUBZone Small Business Concerns at http://dsbs.sba.gov/dsbs/search/dsp_searchhubzone.cfm
- Only firms on the List are HUBZone SBCs and eligible for HUBZone contracting preferences and awards



HUBZone Program – Status

Status as a HUBZone Small Business Concern

- To be eligible for a HUBZone contract, a concern must be a HUBZone SBC both at the time it submits its initial offer AND at the time of contract award [13 CFR 126.601(c)]
- A HUBZone SBC may joint venture with one or more other small business concerns or its SBA-approved mentor for the purpose of submitting an offer for a HUBZone contract.

Note: The joint venture itself need not be certified as a qualified HUBZone SBC.



HUBZone Program – Contract Requirements

- Requirements to Bid on HUBZone Contract (13 CFR 126.601)
 - When a HUBZone SBC submits its initial offer on a specific HUBZone contract, it must certify to the CO that:
 - It is a certified HUBZone SBC that appears on SBA's List;
 - There has been no material change in its circumstances that could affect its HUBZone eligibility since the date of HUBZone certification;
 - It is a small business under the NAICS code assigned to the procurement; and
 - It will "attempt to maintain" the required percentage of employees who are HUBZone residents during the performance of a HUBZone contract.

SDVOSB Program - Background

- Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business (SDVOSB) Pgm FAR Subpart 19.14 & 13 CFR Part 125, Subparts 125-11 to 125-33
 - Veterans Entrepreneurship and Small Business Development Act of 1999 (Public Law 106-50)
 - 3% SDVOSB Goal Established an annual government-wide goal of not less than 3% of the total value of all prime contract and subcontract awards for participation by small business concerns owned and controlled by servicedisabled veterans.
 - Veterans Benefits Act of 2003 (Public Law 108-183)
 - SDVOSB Set-Asides Section 308 of the Act (Public Law 108-183)
 established a procurement program for Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned
 Small Business Concerns (SDVOSBC). This procurement program provides
 that federal contracting officers may restrict competition to SDVOSB concerns
 and award a sole source or set-aside contract where certain criteria are met.



SDVOSB Program - Eligibility

SDVOSB Program Eligibility

- The Service Disabled Veteran (SDV) must have a service-connected disability that has been determined by the Department of Veterans Affairs or Department of Defense
- The SDVOSB concern must be small under the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) code assigned to the procurement
- The SDV must unconditionally own 51% of the SDVOSB concern
- The SDV Owner must control the management and daily operations of the SDVOSB concern
- The SDV must hold the highest officer position in the SDVOSB concern



SDVOSB Program – Set-Aside Considerations

- SDVOSB Set Aside Requirements and Exemption
 - Contracting Officer (CO) may set-aside for SDVOSB if:
 - The requirement is not exempted from SDVO contracting, the CO considers setting aside the requirement for 8(a), HUBZone, or SDVOSB concern participation before considering setting aside the requirement as a small business set-aside.
 - There is a reasonable expectation that at least two responsible SDVOSB concerns will submit offers; and
 - The award can be made at a fair market price.

Exemptions:

- Award fulfilled under Federal Prison Industries, Inc. or Javits-Wagner-O'Day Act participating non-profit agencies for the blind and severely disabled.
- Requirement is currently being performed by an 8(a) participant or SBA has accepted that requirement for performance under the authority of the Section 8(a) Program.



SDVOSBC Program – SBA Interim Final Rule

- □ SBA has issued an interim final rule establishing a Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business Concern (SDVOSBC) Program.
 - SDVOSBC Program establishes:
 - Criteria to be used in federal contracting to determine servicedisabled veteran status;
 - Business ownership and control requirements;
 - Guidelines for establishing sole source and set-aside procurement opportunities
 - Protest and appeal procedures for SDVOSBC procurements

WOSB Program - Background

- Women Owned Small Business (WOSB) Program FAR Subpart 19.5 & 13 CFR Part 127
 - WOSB Federal Contract Program FAR implemented in Feb 2011
 - SBA reason and intent/goal for the Program:
 - Allow WOSBs to compete for set-aside contracts or receive sole source awards in *industries where women-owned* small businesses are substantially underrepresented.
 - Enable Economically Disadvantaged WOSBs (EDWOSBs)
 to compete for set-aside contracts or receive sole source
 awards in industries where women-owned small
 businesses are underrepresented.



WOSB Program Eligibility Requirements

- □ WOSB Program Eligibility Requirements 13 CFR 127.200, 201, & 202
 - Must meet small business size standard for primary NAICS & contract
 - 51% substantially owned/controlled by one or more women who are U.S. citizens
 - Women must manage the day-to-day operations
 - A woman must the hold highest officer position in the business and this woman must work at the business full-time during normal working hours
 - Women must make the long-term decisions for the business

WOSB Program Certification

WOSB & EDWOSB Self Certification Process

- Step 1: Provide all required documents to certify@sba.gov)
- Step 2: Updating status as a WOSB or an EDWOSB on SAM.gov
- Important: To claim self-certification, besides Steps 1 & 2 above must also not use a TPC and must also make a representation as a WOSB or EDWOSB eligible under the WOSB Program in SAM.

WOSB & EDWOSB TPC Certification Process

- Have the option to obtain WOSB or EDWOSB certification from one of the four SBA-approved Third-Party Certifiers (TPCs). They are:
 - El Paso Hispanic Chamber of Commerce
 - National Women Business Owners Corporation
 - US Women's Chamber of Commerce
 - Women's Business Enterprise National Council
- 8(a) Certification (with Supporting Docs)



^{**} **Note:** The National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for Fiscal Year 2016 eliminated the self-certification process for the WOSB Program, although the change is not currently effective. SBA is currently reviewing how to implement this change. Until the change is implemented, eligible WOSB or EDWOSB firms may continue to self-certify.

WOSB Program – Important Information

- 5% government wide goal for WOSB contracts
- WOSB Set-asides available in limited industries based on NAICS codes
 - Important: The NAICS code assigned to the solicitation must be authorized for use under the WOSB Program. Not all NAICS codes are authorized for use under the WOSB Program. Check the SBA website at www.sba.gov/wosb for available NAICS codes.
 - Separate NAICS codes are authorized for WOSB and EDWOSB.
 - 364 NAICS codes are available for WOSB
 - 80 NAICS codes are authorized for EDWOSB.
- Contracting Officers must verify whether offerors have provided all the required documents to WOSB Repository at <u>certify.sba.gov</u>. FAR 19.1505(e) & 19.1503(b)
- EDWOSB is a subset of WOSB. As such, if you qualify as an EDWOSB, you automatically qualify as a WOSB.

WOSB Program NAICS Codes 2017 Updates

■ Women Owned Small Business (WOSB) 2017 NAICS Updates

 Effective October 1, 2017, the SBA updated its table of the North American Industry Classification System ("NAICS") codes, which resulted in numerous changes. NAICS 2017 created 21 new NAICS industries by reclassifying, splitting, or merging 29 industries or their parts previously under NAICS 2012

On October 11, 2017, SBA also updated the NAICS codes applicable for the WOSB Program to align with the 2017 NAICS codes. This update reduces the number of four-digit NAICS industry groups eligible for procurements under the WOSB Program from 113 to 112 because NAICS 2017 merged two NAICS 2012 industry groups, NAICS 5171 and 5172, into one—5173.
